#### **Bioscience Commercialization Intern**

The proposed Commercialization Internship program which has been discussed among BSA committee members, and representatives from UNM, New Mexico Tech (NMT) and New Mexico State University (NMSU), involves the hire of **1**-**3** interns per research university:

- 1) UNM **(1-3)**
- 2) New Mexico Tech (1-3)
- 3) New Mexico State University (1-3)

The interns will support the transfer of technology or the creation of businesses or commercialization of research university innovations applicable to biosciences. ED Tofighi said the positions included mentors when it was first discussed but it was decided that interns at UNM, NMSU and NMT would work directly with the NMBSA or with their institution's Technology Transfer offices in the case of NMSU and NMT.
